

Minimum Standard Health Protocols for the Coryell County Judiciary

Recognizing the need to ensure the health and safety of all individuals entering the court facilities, the courts of Coryell County will implement the following minimum standard health protocols at the discretion of the presiding judge:

Require face coverings, practice social distancing, and practice appropriate hygiene recommendations.

Provide notice to individuals who are in vulnerable population of the ability to contact the court to identify themselves as a vulnerable individual and receive accommodations.


Ask individuals entering courtroom facilities, if they have tested positive for COVID-19 within the previous ten (10) days, had symptoms of COVID-19 within the previous ten (10) days, or had recent known exposure to COVID-19 within the previous fourteen (14) days. Individuals who indicate yes to any of these questions will be refused admittance to the court facility.

Provide a face mask or face shield to individuals entering the courtroom facilities.

Clean the common areas of the court facility and the courtroom frequently and sufficiently enough to ensure the safety of all participants involved in the court proceedings

As the local administrative district judge, I will maintain communication with the local health authority and county judge, and adjust the minimum standard health protocols with conditions in the county.
